Description:

Marine and coastal ecosystems in the Euro-Mediterranean region are among the most diverse and productive in the world, providing invaluable services including food supply, climate regulation, tourism, and cultural heritage, among others. However, these ecosystems, and the biodiversity that they support, are under severe threat due to pollution, overfishing, habitat destruction, and the impacts of climate change. The urgency of restoring these vital ecosystems has led to significant policy initiatives, particularly within the Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) and other related policies such as the European Union's Nature Restoration Law, the EU Biodiversity Strategy for 2030 and the SAP-BIO of the Mediterranean Action Plan (MAP).

With the goal of restoring at least 20% of the world's land and sea areas by 2030 under Target 2 of the GBF, it is crucial to address knowledge and capacity gaps and foster cross-border collaboration for successful restoration actions.





























This event aims to bring together a diverse group of relevant stakeholders to discuss the challenges and promote solutions associated with marine and coastal restoration efforts in the Euro-Mediterranean region. These stakeholders come from different territorial perspectives and contribute to the successful implementation of restoration initiatives that align with key regional and international policies.

One of the outcomes of the event will be to gather insights from the experts around policy obstacles and solutions for an effective restoration in the EuroMed area. These insights will be collected into a joint policy statement from the community of the Mission for Natural Heritage. This statement will be circulated to key policymakers and promoted within the activities of Dialogue4Nature project.

This institutional dialogue is part of a series of events organised by the Dialogu4Nature project under the Interreg Euro-MED Mission for Natural Heritage. The Mission aims to upscale knowledge and results produced within the Euro-Mediterranean region and to transfer and mainstream them into effective policies. The Dialogue4Nature project hosts an annual policy symposium that addresses a key thematic area relevant to the Mediterranean natural context. This event is designed to promote the best solutions emerging from the Interreg Euro-MED community and beyond, supporting policymakers in strengthening the implementation of current or new policies, as well as addressing governance gaps.

Key Audience: Policymakers, practitioners, researchers, and environmental NGOs from the North and the South of the Mediterranean. Authorities at macro-regional, national and sub-national levels responsible for restoring ecosystems in their area of influence.

Objectives:

- Foster debate and share examples from Interreg Euro-MED projects around marine and coastal restoration within the Mission for Natural Heritage.
- Promote regional cooperation and knowledge sharing about restoration among Euro-Mediterranean countries, bringing the perspective from both North and Southern stakeholders.
- Gather insights and expert advice from the participants regarding the definition of a common position for the Mission for Natural Heritage around restoration
